

## Rustic Little Christmas Trees

Quick and easy garter stitch Christmas tree

### **MATERIALS**

For each tree

Yarn: Sport Weight 13 metres/15 yards

**Shown In:** *Blacker Yarns Limited Edition Brushwork* Colour: Craquelure 50g = 152

metres/165 yards (Scottish

Bowmont/Castlemilk Moorit/Alpaca).

**Needles:** 2.5mm

**Notions:** Tapestry needle

### TENSION/GAUGE

38 sts x 32 rows =  $10 \times 10 \text{ cm}$  with 2.5 mm in garter stitch

#### **SIZE**

Each tree measures 10cm/4" from base to top by 7.5cm/3" at its widest point

You can make the trees using any weight of yarn, but be sure to use a needle one size smaller than what is recommended. For example, if the recommended needle is a 4mm, you should use a 3mm. You want the trees to be firm, which helps them to resist curling.



#### STANDARD KNITTING ABBRIEVIATIONS

CO – Cast on

**K** – Knit

St(s) Stitch

**PSSO** – Pass slipped stitch over **K2** 

**K2tog** – Knit two stitches together

#### **PATTERN**

The trees are knitted from the bottom up

Cast on 5 sts and knit 6 rows of garter stitch.

At end of last row, cast on 8sts, you will now have 13sts in total.

Knit across all stitches and end of row cast on another 8sts. (21sts)

## **Continue as follows**

**Rows 1 - 5:** Knit

Row 6: K1, sl. K1, psso, knit to last 3 sts k2tog

Repeat the last six rows until 5sts remain.

Work 5 more rows of knit

**Row 60**: K1, K2tog twice (3sts)

Knit 3 more rows

**Row 64:** K1, k2tog (2sts)

K2tog, cut yarn and pull tail through last stitch.

Sew in ends.



If you're making individual trees, you could crochet a chain from the top of the tree. Alternatively, you could attach a little piece of ribbon and maybe even a button.

The trees can be left plain or decorated with embroidery, buttons, sequins or beads.

To make a garland, you'll need to attach your trees to a length of string, ribbon or crochet chain.





# Rustic Little Christmas Tree Garland

## **Instructions**



Using your cocktail stick to apply a small amount of glue to the front of your peg, attach the button. Hold in place for a few seconds and then clip onto a piece of paper and leave to dry.

Cut a length of garden string and peg your trees on the line.

## Gather your supplies

#### You will need

Knitted Christmas trees, Mini wooden pegs, garden twine, wooden star buttons, strong glue and a bamboo skewer or cocktail stick.
